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In-work Support Scheme

Have you worked in this industry for more than 2 years? Are you experiencing hardship? NewstrAid could help

Our in-work support scheme offers a wide range of help and support for people in work who are going through a difficult time.

For example, applicants may have encountered:

- · An unexpected family expense
- III health
- Redundancy
- Family breakdown
- Bereavement

How we help

We offer both financial assistance and general welfare support to people working in the news trade.

One-off welfare grants

Available to address specific needs for those who have encountered unexpected hardship*. Funding may be approved to help meet essential living costs, replace essential household appliances or disability equipment.

Anxiety Support

Our Anxiety Support Helpline is run in partnership with Anxiety UK and is available, free of charge, to anyone who is struggling to cope with day to day stress and are worried about their mental health.

State Benefit Advice Service

Our welfare team is trained to advise on all benefits and this includes working age schemes as well as benefits for those facing retirement. We can also advise those who work part time and have children or elderly relatives to care for.

Debt Advice

NewstrAid provides a dedicated Debt Advice Helpline in partnership with the Debt Advice Foundation, which is open to everyone with a news trade connection.

Information & Signposting

In cases where we cannot help directly, every effort will be made to refer people on to relevant organisations who can offer support.

Home Visiting Service:

Home visits are available to those who wish to discuss their situation away from the workplace. Our team of volunteers are happy to visit and offer personal one-to-one support.

Who's who at NewstrAid

Interview with Neil Jagger, Chief Operating Officer, Reach Nationals

Q. How long have you worked in the news trade and where did you start?

A. I left school and decided to take a year out to help pay my way through a French and History degree at Birmingham University, got a job with Yorkshire Post newspapers and fell in love with the industry. That was almost 40 years ago

Q. What 3 things helped you get to the position you are in today?

A. Hard work, enthusiasm for the industry and the people working in it and always wanting to win

Q. What is the biggest change you have seen in the industry during the time you have worked within it? Internet access to free news provision when you want it, where you want it, how you want it and on what device you want it

Q. How do you think the industry is likely to change over the next 10 years?

A. More consolidation at all levels of the news supply chain from publisher to distributor to retailer. Digital first publishing will be the norm with newspapers occupying a very important but more niche position in the provision of news

Q. What is the biggest challenge you face in your current role?

A. Hitting the required profit number and the pressure this brings on the cost base – it's a juggling act to always maintain quality across the

newspaper portfolio but at a lower cost

Q. If you didn't work in the news trade, what do you think you would do for a living?

A. Who knows – I might even have been successful! But would I trade my career for anything else? Not in a million!

Q. How do you see the future for news retailers in the UK?

A. There are many campaigns praising the great British High Street – it's an institution and part of our heritage. News retailers are a fundamental part of that because newspapers and magazines are a special part of our lives. Keep the news category alive and well and news retailers will continue to be a fundamental part of British life and the free speech we all enjoy.

Q. How long have you been involved with NewstrAid?

A. I have been involved with NewstrAid for over 25 years when I served on the West Yorkshire Committee with Harry Slack, Gordon Morrish and Ossie Harrigan – 3 icons of the Leeds newsagents scene way back when

Q. What do you currently do for the

A. I am Chairman of the Trustee

Q. Why do you support NewstrAid?

A. It's an industry I love and that has



looked after me and my family for all of my working life. It's the least that I and my colleagues at NewstrAid can do to help those in our industry that have been less fortunate and need some financial or emotional support

Q. Have you or anyone you know benefited from the support that NewstrAid provides and if so, what was the impact on your/their life?

A. Not directly however as an Almoner in Leeds I remember delivering a TV on Christmas Eve to a beneficiary whose TV had literally exploded days before. The sheer joy at my (or rather the TV's) arrival was one of the most heart-warming moments I have experienced

Q. In a nutshell... why do you think everyone in the news trade should support NewstrAid?

A. Because it's about fellowship, goodwill, caring and just being a decent person

CASE STUDY 1: Helping families with the transition to Universal Credit

Miss P, an ex-newsagent with a young family, called NewstrAid in distress as she had recently been moved from Income Support to Universal Credit and had run out of money for the month. She was also being affected by the benefits changes as her income had been reduced under the new system. She was struggling and in desperate need for funds to help clear her rent arrears and help put food on the table.

NewstrAid were able to advise her regarding applying for a Discretionary Housing Payment and give her telephone numbers for her local authority and family support team to see if they could help her apply for further benefits. She

was also awarded with an emergency hardship grant to help with her rent arrears.



CASE STUDY 2: Support with Mobility Equipment

Mr G had been a newsagent for his entire working life and was now retired. After an illness resulted in him having his leg amputated, he contacted NewstrAid to see if we could help him pay for a mobility assessment from an Occupational Therapist as his mobility needs had now changed.

NewstrAid were able to help fund the Occupational Therapist visit and also provide funding for an electric wheelchair which was recommended following the visit.
