We must also thank our Welfare committee members, a group of volunteers from the industry who work alongside our welfare team and review all the applications for help. Since lockdown they have been meeting on a monthly basis via video conference to ensure people facing hardship receive help quickly.

Thanks to the support of a number of different businesses we were also able to send all our regular beneficiaries a treat hamper in May to show them that even if they were having to isolate, they weren't alone.

The response we received from the hamper recipients was absolutely overwhelming and a full report can be found on page 3.

NewstrAid Small Society Lotteries and 200 clubs

A number of NewstrAid's Area Committees run '200 clubs' or 'small society lotteries' throughout the UK with all proceeds going towards NewstrAid's charitable work.

For a weekly entry fee, ranging from £1 to £1.80, depending upon the local area committee, subscribers are entered into a monthly (in one case, quarterly) random draw for a variety of cash prizes.

The average chance of winning a prize is 1 in 150 (much better odds than the national lottery!), and every month a typical prize is greater than £200 with

a total of £270,000 being awarded in prizes over the course of a year.

The money raised through these lotteries allows us to help thousands of beneficiaries every year and is an essential source of income for our work.

We would like to say a huge **thank you** to everyone who contributes to NewstrAid in this way. Your small weekly contribution makes a huge difference to people from the industry who are facing hardship every day!

Spotlight on.... NewstrAid Area Committees

NewstrAid have 13 Area Committees across the UK who help us to fundraise and raise awareness about the charity. Each committee is made up of volunteers from the industry and typically meet quarterly, with many committees organising fundraising events throughout the year. A typical meeting agenda will focus on income/revenue generated by the 200-club lottery, local events and a head office update.

NewstrAid or NFRN Assist?

We often get enquiries from news retailers who are confused about whether they should contact NFRN **Assist** or **NewstrAid** for help with an issue. Although we sometimes work alongside each other, NFRN Assist and NewstrAid are separate organisations that help with different types of problems.

In short, NewstrAid cannot provide help and support to your business, we can only help individuals with emotional and financial support for non-business issues as well as offering advice on welfare issues such as state benefit entitlement.

A few years ago we teamed up with NFRN Assist to create the Fresh Start Assist scheme, specifically for news retailers facing financial and emotional difficulties.

Deciding to cease trading is a very difficult decision to make and this is where the **NFRN Assist Scheme** can help. Trading newsagents can discuss their business problems in detail before making a final decision. In addition, NFRN Assist has specialist advisers who can help to manage cash flow, structure debts and advise on the viability of a business.

NFRN Assist can be contacted by calling **0800 043 0215** for business advice and support. You do not have to be a member of the NFRN to use this service.

If, after considering your business problems you decide that the time has come to cease trading, **NewstrAid** can help you to readjust to life after retail. If you are worried about what lies ahead, we can help to give you a Fresh Start by offering the following welfare services:

- · Welfare grants, including help with home relocation
- Anxiety Support
 – Free phone Helpline **0800 138 6552**. Including counselling for victims of retail crime.
- State benefits advice
- Advice on family welfare issues
- Support for the disabled and carers
- One to one personal support
- Access to free professional debt advice and funding for debt solutions (IVA/DRO/bankruptcy etc)

Fresh Start Assist is open to all newsagents and their staff, not just NFRN members.



Where your money goes

CASE STUDY 1: CORONAVIRUS SUPPORT

Mr S of North London, a trading newsagent was struggling to breakeven before the Coronavirus pandemic, but closure for 8 weeks during lockdown made his situation even more difficult. Most of his stock had expired and he was worried about managing his debt commitments. The financial stress was starting to affect his mental health as he had a poorly wife, two children and an elderly mother all dependent on the business.

NewstrAid arranged a referral to the NFRN Business Support Service and advised him to apply for Universal Credit. Our Anxiety Support Helpline was made available to him and a grant of £2,000 was awarded from our Fresh Start Assist Fund to help him meet family living costs until he could recommence trading.

CASE STUDY 2: CORONAVIRUS SUPPORT

Before the lockdown, Mrs C who had managed a newsagency with her husband for many years, was struck down with Covid -19 and was not well enough to work for a prolonged period, resulting in a reduced income and difficulty making ends meet

NewstrAid awarded a hardship grant to help her until she was able to resume working and we also funded a new TV as her old one needed replacing.

CASE STUDY 3: HELP FOR CHILDREN

A support worker at the Children's Cancer Trust contacted us to see if we could help Mrs V who had been on maternity leave from her job as a full-time shop assistant at WHSmiths when her young baby was diagnosed with a rare form of cancer. Forced into taking extended leave to care for her poorly baby, the family were struggling to survive on a reduced income. Frequent hospital appointments both locally and in London were putting a further strain on the family finances.

NewstrAid awarded a grant from the ACE Children's Fund to help meet family costs during this very difficult time. We also delivered state benefit advice to help the family maximise their income and the Anxiety Support Service was made available to all family members.
