Introducing our new Cost of Living Crisis Fund

Created in response to the current Cost of Living Crisis, this fund offers grants of up to £250 per household to help bridge the gap between income and costs for anyone with a newstrade connection who is facing hardship.



Neil Jagger, CEO for NewstrAid said: "With millions of people cutting back on energy use and reducing their spend on food and essentials as a direct result of the cost of living crisis, we felt it was vital to launch a fund that can provide some financial assistance to anyone in the industry who is finding it difficult to make ends meet."

Neil Jagger added, "This special fund has been created particularly with those who don't already receive help from us in mind. The cost of living crisis is putting everyone's finances under pressure and this fund aims to help those who may not have received support before but whose household finances are now at breaking point."

Winter comfort grant helps hundreds from the newstrade to keep warm this winter.

In direct response to the current cost of living crisis, we recently added a supplement to the annual Winter Comfort Grant we pay to around 400 of our most vulnerable beneficiaries during October.

Grants totalling £100,000 were distributed to hundreds of industry colleagues who need the most support. The grants will help recipients to cover the cost of heating bills, buy warm bedding and purchase winter clothing over the coming months.

Sinead Flood, Welfare Manager for NewstrAid said: "Each year our Winter Comfort Grant helps hundreds of our beneficiaries to keep warm over the winter period. Having added a supplement to last year's grant in response to the economic situation in 2021, we felt compelled to review the amount again in 2022 and have included an additional uplift to the grants paid to households this October. We hope the increased grant will go some way to help those who are facing serious hardship this year."

After working in the family newsagents for a number of years, Sarah was sadly diagnosed with cancer. Now, on a low income, the family were struggling to cope with finances and also the devastating cancer diagnosis. NewstrAid were able to give advice on which benefits the family were entitled to and after a full financial assessment, were able to award regular benefit to help with ongoing costs. They also have full use of the Spectrum Life Wellbeing Suite.



Help for Hobbies

Priya had worked in a shop selling newspapers for several years and approached NewstrAid as she was finding it hard to pay her bills as well as her son's football subs. As she fitted the eligibility criteria for the new Help for Hobbies scheme, £250 was awarded to Priya which will allow her son to continue to play football for another year.



In work support

Vasant had been working for a newsagent for several years until ill health forced him to take some time away. With many hospital appointments and bills piling up, he was finding it difficult to get by. After contacting NewstrAid, he was awarded a grant from our In Work Support scheme to help meet living costs whilst he took time off work to recover.
