NewstrAid's FREE Wellbeing Helpline and Online Portal

As we all struggle with the current economic situation, looking after your mental health and resilience is more important than ever. It is worth remembering that NewstrAid's **Wellbeing Suite** is available to anyone with a newstrade connection, is completely **free of charge** and can provide the tools we all need to look after our emotional health.

All calls are answered by a clinically trained psychotherapist/counsellor, where callers receive 1:1 in the moment support via Freephone, Live Chat, WhatsApp, SMS, Email & Request Call Back. A wide range of issues are covered such as:

- depression, anxiety, stress, grief, and bereavement
- relationship and marital problems
- parenting coaching
- managing sleep issues
- work stress and work life balance issues

Call handlers work therapeutically in 40+ languages including Polish, Romanian, Hindu and Punjabi.

The online portal provides access to over 200 hours of mental health & lifestyle resources. Content includes:

Cost of Living help

Following the launch of our Cost of Living Crisis Fund at the end of last year, we have heard from many people who are finding it increasingly difficult to make ends meet during the current economic situation. As a reminder, this special fund offers up to £250 per household to help bridge the gap between income and costs for anyone with a newstrade connection.

Applicants must satisfy the following criteria:

- Live in the UK
- Work or have worked directly in newspaper or magazine sales/ circulation/distribution for a minimum of 2 years, full time
- Have less than £6,000 in household savings



- Wellbeing Podcasts covering a range of topics including mental wellbeing, nutrition, parenting, and health & fitness.
- Self-guided meditation designed in modules to reduce anxiety and stress, improve sleep and increase happiness.
- Seminars featuring informative conversations with experts discussing a range of wellbeing topics.
- Nutrition plans and video recipes
- Fitness tracking, programmes, and workout videos.

If you have a debt problem, the Debt Advice Foundation can help you understand which options are available to you and will recommend the debt solution that is right for your situation.

Beneficiary stories



Cost of Living Crisis Fund

Gus works in a convenience store and contacted us after he saw an advert for our Cost of Living Crisis fund. He lives with his wife and 4 children and had noticed over recent months that finances were becoming increasingly tight. It was getting more and more difficult for them to meet all their monthly bills and ensure that there was enough food for the family to eat. They often fell into their overdraft at the end of the month before wages/benefits were paid in. He also mentioned that the family were weighing up which costs they would have to cut to ensure they did not fall behind on bills.

After reviewing his completed application form, NewstrAid was able to award £250 to the family from the Cost of Living Crisis Fund. The welfare team also signposted Gus and his wife to the Debt Advice Foundation, for budgeting advice and to the Wellbeing Suite portal for lots of practical and wellbeing advice for the family.



Help for Hobbies

Since starting to play Ice Hockey 18 months earlier Helen's daughter had shown a real aptitude for the game. Her school had also noted what a positive impact it was having on her general performance in the classroom. However, Helen was struggling financially and could not see how she could continue to cover the cost of her daughter's sports kit and fees.

Helen was encouraged to apply for a Help for Hobbies grant and after a full assessment was awarded £250.

"Thanks to financial support from NewstrAid's Help for Hobbies Fund my daughter was able to continue with her hobby, Ice Hockey, which has become her life now. She is today, on the first of three regional trials which will hopefully result in her being picked to train and then play a game for England V Slovakia. None of this would have been possible without the generous funding from NewstrAid."
