## Cost of Living Crisis Fund receives record number of applications

During 2023 we have received a record number of applications for help, with the vast majority of applicants being awarded a grant from NewstrAid's **Cost of Living Crisis Fund**.

This special fund was launched in Autumn 2022 specifically to provide financial support during the cost of living crisis. It offers a £250 non-repayable grant (per household, per year), to help bridge the gap between income and expenditure and has already helped hundreds of people who work or have worked in the sale or distribution of magazines and newspapers in the UK.

It is important to highlight that those who were awarded a Cost of Living Crisis Fund grant last year are eligible



to apply again this year. Additionally, anyone with a newstrade connection can apply for financial help and contact us for advice and emotional support should they need it.

#### **Winter Comfort Grant 2023**

As the nights draw in and temperatures start to cool, many of our beneficiaries are concerned about the cost of heating and other household bills over the winter months.

We were therefore delighted that our Board of Trustees recently approved a Winter Comfort Grant of £150 per household for all our regular beneficiaries.

Around 400 households received this grant which aims to alleviate stress and hardship by helping with winter heating



bills, the purchase of new winter clothing or the cost of warm blankets and bedding during the colder weather.

#### **New Online Application Process**

Working in partnership with tech innovators Lightning Reach, we have recently launched a new online application portal to speed up the process for those needing financial support.

The Lightning Reach portal uses trusted and secure cutting-edge technology to streamline the application process, minimise fraud, and connect people in need with financial support from a variety of providers.

Anyone in need can access the portal for free and apply for a range of support, quickly and easily. Applicants complete a generic form, after which they are given a list of relevant charities to apply to. Charity partners like NewstrAid then have a bespoke application form built into the portal which eligible applicants will be asked to complete.

#### **Cost of Living Crisis Fund**

Father of three, Jordan, heard about NewstrAid from his employer for whom he has worked for 10 years. He was struggling to pay his household bills and buy food for his family due to the cost of living crisis.

After contacting NewstrAid, Jordan was encouraged to complete a Cost of Living Crisis Fund application form and once assessed by the NewstrAid team, was successfully awarded a grant of £250 to help cover his bills.

won this award. The last year has been extremely challenging for everyone and has seen our team process a record number of applications for help from people facing hardship. This award acknowledges the hard work that goes into providing this support to the newspaper and magazine industry during some really tough times."

### Emotional and Financial support

Syeda was on long term sick leave following an armed robbery that took place whilst she was working. She was struggling to cope both financially and emotionally following the experience. The trauma she faced at the shop was having a long-term effect on her mental health and she felt she could not return to work.

NewstrAid were able to fund a series of counselling sessions for Syeda to help her come to terms with her experience and move forward. In addition, and following a full financial assessment, she was awarded regular benefit and more recently has been awarded one off grants to help with rent arears and general hardship whilst she is unable to work.



#### **Financial support**

Retailer Bilal lost the sight in one eye following a horrific acid attack in his shop. The effect on his mental health has been immense. His relationship broke down and he has not worked since the attack.

Although his trade connection was relatively short, following a full financial assessment, the NewstrAid Welfare Committee made him a regular beneficiary which means he receives 3 grant payments throughout the year. In addition, he has also been awarded one-off Samaritan grants to help with the cost of household goods such as a microwave and hoover.

#### Yorkshire 3 Peaks challenge raises more than £6,500

In September, NewstrAid CEO, Neil Jagger along with Finance Director, Laura Grice and Welfare Manager, Katie Babooram, joined a group of industry fundraisers from companies including Marketforce and DMG to conquer the Yorkshire 3 peaks, raising more than £6,500 for NewstrAid.

The challenge took around 12 hours to complete and involved a 24 mile round trip including the peaks of Pen-y-Ghent (694 m), Whernside (736m) and Ingleborough (723m).

Neil Jagger, NewstrAid CEO, said: "I have to admit that none of us were prepared for what a physical and mental challenge



it would be to complete the Yorkshire 3 peaks, but the money it has raised for those who really need it makes it all worthwhile."

All the funds raised from the 3 Peaks challenge will support people from the newspaper and magazine industry who are struggling with the current cost of living crisis.

**Industry Supports NewstrAid on Woolly Wednesday** 

As part of our annual campaign to highlight the support we can provide to those struggling during the colder months, we hosted Woolly Wednesday on 1st November.

The initiative asked industry colleagues to help to raise awareness about the charity by simply pledging their support via social media on Wednesday 1st November 2023 and using the hashtag #WoollyWednesday.

The event saw some great activity on social media and helped to spread the word about the support available from



NewstrAid for those struggling to stay warm and pay their bills this winter.
