As the UK faces an ongoing energy crisis, with over 6 million households reportedly living in fuel poverty according to National Energy Action, NewstrAid has provided a financial boost to around 350 of its beneficiaries by distributing a Winter Comfort Grant to help with heating costs during the colder months.

Fuel poverty is defined as spending more than 10% of household income on energy bills, a reality for millions of families across the country. NewstrAid's Welfare Manager, Katie Babooram, said; "Energy bills are currently around double what they were just two years ago, and for countless families, unaffordable bills and the reality of living in cold, and often damp conditions have become an everyday struggle."

To coincide with the distribution of funds the charity also ran its annual awareness campaign on social media, Woolly Wednesday. The initiative

#### SUPPORT FOLLOWING BEREAVEMENT

Phil had a long history of working in the newstrade and after he lost his wife to brain cancer, his income significantly reduced and he found he was struggling to keep up with his bills. His brother-in-law got in touch with NewstrAid to see if we could offer any help.

After speaking to the welfare team and following a full financial assessment, John was awarded regular benefit which provides him with financial support throughout the year to help him manage his bills and outgoings.

#### SUPPORT FOR CHILDREN

Bella is a carer for her father and also looks after her young son. She started to suffer with some mental health issues after she was made redundant from her role as a supervisor for McColls, and this, coupled with her caring responsibilities meant she had not been able to find a new job and was continuing to struggle financially. She approached NewstrAid for help with the cost of a new school uniform for her son.

Following a visit from a NewstrAid Welfare Volunteer and full financial assessment, it was clear that her financial situation was not likely to improve until she found work. NewstrAid awarded her with regular benefit to help cover the ongoing costs associated with her son until she was able to find employment.



#### GENERAL HARDSHIP FUND

Tariq applied to NewstrAid online via Lightning Reach. He had worked as a shop assistant for 8 years but was recently involved in an incident at work which had led him to stop working. He found himself falling into arrears with his Council Tax and was struggling to pay utility bills and buy food whilst he looked for work.

Following a visit from a NewstrAid Welfare Volunteer it was clear that Tariq was actively looking for work but did not have enough money to cover his weekly expenditure. He was awarded a grant from the General Hardship Fund to help with living costs, as well as a one-off payment to help him clear his Council Tax arrears.

## Help for those struggling with household bills this winter

As the colder weather starts to draw in, we are urging newspaper and magazine retailers and shop staff worried about making ends meet, to make use of the Retailer Support Scheme. The scheme provides both financial and emotional assistance to help ease pressures caused by rising household bills, particularly over the challenging winter months.

"Each winter we see increased demand for support," said Katie Babooram, Welfare Manager at NewstrAid. "We want every retailer and shop worker in the newstrade to know that they are not alone. Our Retailer Support Scheme is here to ensure no one is left struggling with household bills."

The scheme cannot help with business costs but does offer a wide range of non-repayable grants to support those facing personal financial hardship. This includes help with rent, utility bills,



council tax, essential household items, and disability aids. It also provides access to state benefits advice, debt advice, mental health resources, and bereavement support.

Katie added: "By providing practical and financial help, our Retailer Support Scheme ensures that those working on the front line of our industry do not have to choose between keeping warm and feeding their families."
